141/20 Chairman's Report

The works to the pavilion and the entrance to The Gore need to be completed. There will be a working party where all volunteers are welcome.

142/20 Public Contribution

There were none.

143/20 Staffing Committee

Further to the Clerks appraisal at the Staffing Committee meeting on 7th September 2020 the Full Council **agreed** to the Staffing Committees recommendations of:

- The Clerk to remain on increased hours until the next Staffing Committee meeting in March 2021.
- The Clerks salary will increase inline with the National Salary Awards. This increase will be backdated to April 2020 as agreed September 2019 minute ref: 192/19.

144/20 Highways Committee

Following a site meeting with KCC Highways Steward on Friday 21st August, the following works have been agreed:

- Works to take place on a 28-day work stream: Double yellow lines to the War Memorial / The Row, the refreshing of 30 mph roundels to both ends of the village, the refreshing of lines to the High Street, the double yellow lines to the Vicarage Lane/ New Road junction (by the school), refreshing the No Entry to St Marys Road.
- It was agreed that KCC Highways will monitor the bank / verge adjacent to Brogdale, High Street, if substantially damaged they will consider their options.
- The No Entry sign to Cullens Hill is to be replaced.
- The No Entry sign at the junction of St Mays Road and The Square is to be replaced.
- It was agreed that a site meeting will take place to discuss the eroding of the highway adjacent to boundary hedge of Parsonage Farm.

145/20 Communities and Amenities Committee

It was reported that the new website will go live within the next week. Initially this will resemble the previous website, with further discussions to take place regarding the integrated communications 'hub'.

146/20 Environment Working Group

King George V – The Ash, Silver Birch and Sumacs have been felled.

A planting scheme for the North end area has been designed by Hugh Buckhurst, Sylvia Scott and Karen White of Elham Gardening Society and Alfie Gay who is from the White Cliffs Countryside Project The remit given to the group was that the planting scheme needed to be child-friendly, wildlife-friendly and low maintenance. The scheme will be shown to Play for Elham for their comments. If Play for Elham agree and approve the scheme, costings will be collated and put to the Parish Council. The planting would take place between November and February. Thank you to all involved.

We are trying to plan a Family Environment Day in the Spring.

We have been granted 840 saplings by Woodlands Trust; we will need to arrange the planting of these.

147/20 Telecomms Committee

After a brief discussion regarding the transparency of groups representing the community, it was **resolved** that a Telecomms Committee would be formed. The

Committee will be members of the Council and non-council members. It was agreed that Cllr Lamb, Clements, Stanyon and Swan would be Council members.

148/20 Terms of Reference

- 2) It was agreed to adopt the Terms of Reference for Wellbeing Committee.

149/20 Policies

It was **agreed**, with the minor amendment, to adopt the Social Media Policy.

150/20 Planning

- 1) The receipt of received applications was **noted** and comments **agreed**: 20/1091/FH Extension to barn Little Droveway, Droveway, Stelling Minnis. **Resolved: No objections / comments.**
 - 20/0747/FH Kings Arms, The Square Proposal for single storey rear extension, new toilet facilities within existing outbuilding and refurbishment works to include hotel rooms to the first floor. Resolved: To object with the following comments Elham Parish Council objects to this planning application due the adverse impact that the increase of off-site car parking would have on the village. Car parking would be generated for ten hotel rooms, a manager's bedsit and associated additional staff and no provision is being made on site for this. The village already has a problem with car parking capacity and this development would have an unacceptable, adverse, knock-on effect to the surrounding streets. The Parish Council notes that, in section 16 of the planning application, it says that no trees are affected, whereas it appears that a significant acer would have to be removed. Also, that in section 19 it says that there is no new residential accommodation whereas the proposed development includes a manager's bedsit in part of the additional buildings.
- 2) To **note** receipt of received application since the agenda was issued and **agree** comments.
 - 20/0994/FH Boyke Bungalow, Boyke Lane, Rhodes Minnis Demolition of existing semi detached bungalow and erection of detached 3 bed chalet bungalow. Demolition of existing garage and erection of new detached garage as a replacement. Re-model of drive to facilitate parking and turning. **Resolved: No objections / comments.**
- 3) Decisions made by Folkestone and Hythe District Council were **noted:** 20/0730/FH The Well House, St Marys Road, Elham -The Listed Building Consent for removal of lift, removal of wall, reinstatement of a partition wall to allow original door to be reused. Removal of stud work encasing the stair and associated door forming the fire regulations to the lift. **Approved with conditions.**
 - 20/0652/FH Hornsdown Cottage, The Row, Elham conversion of roofspace and extension to an existing garage building. **Approved with conditions.** 20/0852/FH The Oast, Fir Tree Hill, Bladbean Proposed replacement single storey extension. **Refused The proposed contemporary style of windows, glazing and doors proposed would contrast with the traditional features of the host building and would appear out of keeping. The proposed extension**

would harm the character and appearance of the existing building, the character of the street scene, the surrounding countryside and the AONB, contrary to Local Plan Review Policies BE1, BE8, CO1 and CO21, Core Strategy Policies DSD and CSD4, Emerging Local Plan Policies HB1, HB8, NE3 and HE1, and Core Strategy Review Submission Policies SS1 and CSD4.

20/0859/FH – New Road, Elham – Works to trees covered by TPOs. **Approved** with conditions.

20/0558/FH – Little Orchard, Exted Hill – Change of conservatory to dining room and new front porch to replace existing. – **Approved with conditions.** Y19/0248/FH – adj Land Railway Cottages, Duck Street, Elham – further to a FHDC Planning and Licensing Committee meeting on 25th August 2020 it was resolved: To refuse planning permission on the grounds that the application site is outside of the settlement confines, within AONB and as such would result in harm to the character of rural area.

151/20 Consultations

- 3) It was **agreed** that Elham Parish Council would not be submitting a response to The Kent Downs AONB draft Management Plan 2020-2025 consultation.
- 4) It was **agreed** that Elham Parish Council would not be submitting a response to the England Tree Strategy Defra Citizen Space consultation.
- 5) It was **agreed** that a working group would compose a response to the Governments 3no. consultations on reform of planning:
 - i. <u>Changes to the current planning system</u> and agree response if required (deadline 1st October 2020).
 - ii. Planning for the future the planning white paper (deadline 29th October 2020).
 - iii. <u>Transparency and competition: a call for evidence on data on land control</u> (deadline 29th October 2020).

152/20 Finance

• County Councillor – Susan Carey

A reminder to everyone that we set the date of Saturday 26thSeptember for our annual Streamclean of the Nailbourne to reduce the flood risk in advance of the winter rains. Please join me from 10 am and bring wheelbarrows if you can, other equipment is provided.

On Thursday 10 September the County Council will meet to agree changes to our budget for 2020/21. It is unprecedented for us to do this but our income has been hit and our costs increased by the pandemic. Whilst we have received support from the

Government it is not enough to meet the expected gap of £36,3m. There are only a few areas where we can find such short-term savings. Looking ahead to our budget for 2021/22 the challenge is even greater. Social services now account for over half our spending and with those over 85 the fastest growing age group in the country we expect demand for social care will continue to grow.

There are still some reasons to be cheerful. In my own area of responsibility at KCC we are making progress on reducing carbon emissions and cost. We have two targets. For our own services and estate we have an accelerated target of Net Zero by 2030 and for Kent as a whole we are aligned with the Government's commitment of Net Zero by 2050. A district heat project (using heat from the River Medway), solar panels on our own buildings and a switch to LED lights in our buildings and for highways bollards and signs are all saving money and reducing carbon emissions. We have just launched a group buying scheme for Kent householders and community buildings called Solar Together which uses KCC's procurement expertise to get the best price from reputable Kent solar panel businesses. We also have an Electric Vehicle Charging Point scheme (you should have received a letter about this) for community buildings/car parks.

Also in my area of responsibility, I'm pleased to report that we are raising the number of reservations each household can make at a Household Waste Recycling Centre from two per household per month to four and increasing the slots available at our busiest sites (including Folkestone).

You will have seen in the news that KCC is in breach of its statutory duty to care for Unaccompanied Asylum-Seeking Children. The numbers arriving in Kent this year have used up all available social workers, foster parents and accommodation. We will continue to care for those already in our care and for citizen children in Kent who need taking into care but we have told the Home Office that we can no longer safely take any further UASC arrivals.

There have also been reports in the media about local government re-organisation - amalgamating districts and counties and ultimately having regional mayors. My own view is that this is an unwelcome distraction at a time when we are both trying to recover from the effects of the pandemic and prepare for Brexit. I will share news on this if and when it develops.
