We, along with members of the parish who are interested in twinning, had a really proactive meeting with members from Ambleteuse last week. They have proposed the invitation of a return visit to Ambleteuse in August to potentially sign a twinning commitment document. In the meantime, the Clerk will be contacting the village groups, organisations and the school to arrange an exchange of contact details.

I have been contacted by members of the parish who are dismayed with the bus situation. We have been asked if we can pursue the idea of a community bus. The SOS Save Our 17 Bus are in communications with Stagecoach with the aim to have the cancelled bus service reinstated. There will be an agenda item at a future meeting to discuss the idea of a community bus.

113.23 County Councillor Susan Carey - Member for Elham - Valley Kent County Council -. Report to Elham Parish Council 06 June 2023

One of the many services paid for by your Council tax is Kent Scientific Services (KSS) which conducts the analysis of goods to see that they contain what the label says. They work closely with Trading Standards which is another service your council tax funds. Both services were in the spotlight last week when Rishi Sunak visited the KSS laboratory to launch a national campaign against the marketing of vapes to those under 18. He was shown a test, developed by KSS Scientist Punil Sanatcumar, to identify the levels of dangerous ingredients in vapes which are being imported. It's against the law for vapes to be sold to anyone under 18 but some retailers have been giving free samples to get youngsters to take up the habit and become future customers. Trading Standards will be increasing activity to intercept and test imported vapes at ports around Kent to protect consumers from harm.

You may have seen coverage in the media about a consultation from KCC to make an annual saving of £1m from the costs of running our Household Waste Recycling Centres. The consultation is still being written and is expected to start mid July and last 12 weeks. KCC has a network of 19 sites (we opened a large new one at Allington last year) and one option includes closing up to four of the smaller sites or reducing opening hours. There is also a separate saving of £605,000 in our budget from measures to take trade waste from small businesses, opening bags at the HWRCs to extract recyclable material and initiatives to reduce or re-use waste. It's one of several difficult savings (£55m in total) KCC needs to make in order to keep funding social care services to the most vulnerable in Kent. Council tax rose by 5% but our costs (like everyone else's) have risen by much more and we must make savings. Decisions will only be made once all the comments from the consultation have been collated and considered. The need for the saving is absolute but how we go about this is very much open for discussion.
